

## English: Literary Studies (LTS)

### For students admitted Fall 2016 and after

- Major Requirements: 36 credit hours total (21 credits LTS Core Requirements + 15 credits English Major Electives)
- Major GPA Requirements: 2.5 minimum in major required to graduate
- Grade Requirements: C- or better must be earned in each English course for it to count toward major requirements
